Media Release – Last lashes out at so-called regional forum

Member for Burdekin, Dale Last MP, has asked a simple question with regards to Monday's Ayr Regional Forum; "what has it delivered"?

Mr Last described the attendance of 2 Ministers and an assistant minister as a "box ticking exercise" and labelled their appearance as "sneaky".

"What we saw on Monday was a couple of Labor members, ministers and an assistant minister sneak into town for some photos and to tick a box," he said. "You only have to look at the program's website for proof that, since August last year, nothing has happened."

"The Burdekin community has a right to ask, what did they bring to town and what commitments have they made for our community going forward? Talk is cheap, we want to see some real commitments from this Labor Government."

"The Police Minister's attendance is an insult because, almost 3 years ago at a Community Crime Forum, he promised to come back and update residents who expressed real concern. Since then, he has snuck into town twice but hasn't had the guts to look those same people in the eye again."

"During the Estimates hearings last December, I asked the Minister for Rural Communities what engagement he had actually undertaken with rural communities. He dodged the question then and, from what we saw on Monday, ignoring the real issues in rural communities remains Labor's attitude."

Mr Last said Burdekin residents would see straight through "Labor's charade".


"Labor Ministers can pose for all the photos they like but locals know that the current government, as a whole, has failed them," Mr Last said. "People will never forget that it was the same government who portrayed our farmers as environmental vandals and the same government that denied there was a problem with youth crime."

"To try and cover their tracks, they have recruited well-meaning members of the community but one quick glance at the programs website shows four meetings over a 10-month period with no further information."



"Perhaps those Ministers would like to come back to the Burdekin and front up to locals. Until they do that, all the photos in the world won't achieve much at all for our district."
